ROBB COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

Commencing in 2020 the scholarships below were combined to create the Robb College Residential Scholarship Pathways that con-currently provide 18 students financial support up to \$12,000 for a three-year degree and \$18,000 for a four-year degree or post-graduate qualification. Some of the older awards criteria were adjusted slightly to enable the pathway.

The BCJ Meredith Scholarship

This scholarship was established in 2023 to recognise the first Head of College, the late Mr Ben Meredith and his leadership and work to establish the College from 1960 to 1966 and his outstanding contribution to the life of the College. The Charles Allan Seymour Hawker Scholarship
