New research shows that UNE has produced a significant number of business leaders, like CEO of Consilidated Pastoral Company, Troy Setter.

Australian cattleman and agribusiness leader Troy Setter who was a former Robb College resident, studied Rural Science at UNE in the 1990s.

Today, Troy is Chairman of The Council of Rural Development Corporations, Dolly's Dream and LiveCorp, as well as CEO of Australia's largest private beef producer and significant cropping operation - Consolidated Pastoral Company (CPC) - and oversees a company worth an estimated \$1.1 billion, an Australian workforce of 180 spread across nine stations Read more >



A celebration of generosity and goodwill


Generous supporters of UNE students gathered in historic Booloominbah last Friday for our annual scholarships luncheon.
